


# FIVE MUSEUMS FOR THE GAMES A PUZZLE ADVENTURE

The three Olympic values are friendship, respect and excellence. The four values added by the Paralympic movement are courage, determination, inspiration and equality. These values will help you in your mission!




#### Welcome to the musée du quai Branly - Jacques Chirac!

The last sleuth left after completing the seven challenges has the correct answer.




#### YOUR CHALLENGE: Smooth sailing



The bow of this boat was used to decorate the front of a racing canoe. Leonard, a para rower, is determined to row down the river that winds through the pages of this booklet and between the works at the museum.

Turn the pages to follow the green and blue rivers: one leads you to the sleuth to disqualify.

Who is it? Three animals on the bow are here to help! They'll lead you to the sleuth whose sentence must be eliminated.

Like the athletes painted on this wall hanging, our friends excel in the art of balance.

This Iranian discipline, a combination of wrestling, strength, flexibility and agility, is still practiced today.

The gymnast's outfit below in the display case is no longer worn today, but it does hold a clue to find the number of a secret sentence to eliminate at the end of the booklet.

Study the outfit carefully. Its patterns inspired one of the two sets of cubes held by Céleste, at the top of the pyramid.

Count the number of cubes in the correct pile and use that number to eliminate a secret sentence.

The small boat in front of you was vital to travel, hunt and fish in the waters of northern America.

We asked Martine and Adam to start the conversation. Which of them uses a palindrome? Find it by reading both words in both directions. The sleuth who used a palindrome does not have the correct secret sentence. Eliminate it from those remaining at the end of the booklet.

Looking for inspiration, William has thrown a boomerang, traditionally used by the Aboriginal peoples of Australia to hunt and fight. William hopes that the sculpted stick he chose will come back with a clue to help him solve the puzzle!

The boomerang has returned with a series of numbers.

Cross out the numbers below that are engraved on one of the boomerangs in the display case. The last number left is the solution: the number of the secret sentence to eliminate on the last page of the booklet!

Eliminate the secret sentences of these two sleuth at the end of the booklet.






### YOUR CHALLENGE: Step it up


Examine them closely and count the number of details you spot in the sleuths' outfits. Beware of any tricks!
