The three Olympic values are friendship, respect and excellence. The four values added by the Paralympic movement are courage, determination, inspiration and equality.



YOUR CHALLENGE: Escape a maze





YOUR CHALLENGE: Push your limits




This work is a beautiful illustration of the artist's love for his wife.

Look through the booklet to find a character in this same sporty position.






YOUR CHALLENGE: Make a difference


